magiste this knyf book of ordenances and man of foyghte  
aruer w<sup>m</sup> lists before yow. 2<sup>o</sup> for that it is soo lynch  
ie of soo good auisement ne discretion made but that it may  
be lightly amendid in requerunge yowre noblesse as hym  
beh as I may or can. That it please yowre benignite  
for to onsee corige and amende the sayde book and to put  
to or to make less as it schall seyn yowr good w<sup>t</sup> good  
man deliberation and auisement of the moste wise valia  
tes and suffisaunt lordes and knyghtes of yowre reibme the  
whiche of dedes of armes haue the moste knowlge. But  
how som en I haue begonne this dede I haue not taken

and for to put to or make less ys neede be w<sup>t</sup> good man  
deliberation and auisement of yow and of yowre reibme the  
whiche of dedes of armes haue the moste knawlege as it  
is abone sayde pleseth yow for to estable approue ordene  
and conferme the seyde book for to be holden in yowre

reibme of Engeland by yowr yowre cyris and successours  
kynges of Engeland. 3<sup>o</sup> firste the quarellis and the  
billis of the appellant and of the defendant schal be ple  
id in the courte before the constable and mishaff. And whē

**H**nd it is to brite that ther schulde be fayre listes won  
ten the pynpal listes betwene the whiche the men of the  
constable and marchall and pgauntes of armes of the kyng  
schulde be for to kepe and defende yf any wolde make  
any offence or fayre armen the tries made in the courte i any  
thinge that myght be agayns the kynges forast mageste  
or lawe of armes and these me schulde be armed at alle tym  
tis. **T**he constable schal hane there as many me of ar  
mes as he wiff and the marchall also bi the assignation of  
the constable and ellis nor the whiche me schal hane the  
kepyng as is seyd. **T**he pgauntes of armes of the kyng  
schal hane the kepyng of gates of the listes and the arc  
tiges yf any schal be made bi the comandement of the seyd  
constable and marchall. **T**he day of bataile the kyng schal  
be in a sege or in a shaffold on heighe and a place schal be  
made for the constable and marchall at the fayre foot of the  
seyd shaffold there where ther schal be. And than schal be  
ayed the plegges of the appellant and defendant for to  
come in to the listes afore the kyng and þeir i the cour  
te as þdnes vi to the appellant and defendant be come  
in the listes and hane made ther other. **T**hen the ap

pellant cometh to his iorney he schal come to the gate of  
the listes in the est in such man as he wiff feste w<sup>t</sup> his  
armes and wepens assynd to hym bi the courte and ther  
he schal abide til he be led in bi the constable so that w<sup>t</sup> he  
he is comen to the seyd gate the constable and marchall  
schal goo thider. And the constable schal axe him what ma

the appellant schal answer I am suche ana. A. de. t. the  
appellant the whiche is come to this iorney s. e. for to doo  
s. e. And than the constable schal open the viser of his  
basinet so that he may playnly see his visage and if it be  
the same man that is the appellant than schal he make  
open the gates of the listes and schal make him entre w<sup>t</sup>  
his seyd armes þowþre vntales and other sensibl necessa  
ries up on hym and also his comitent w<sup>t</sup> hym and than he  
schal lede hym afore the kyng and than to his tent wher  
he schal abide til the defendant be comen. In the same  
man schal be done of the defendant but that he schal en  
tre in at the weste gate of the listes. **T**he constable cler  
schal write and sete in the regestre the courte and the  
houre of the entringe of the appellant and how that he  
entretis the listes on fote and also the harneys of the appel  
lant how that he is armed and w<sup>t</sup> hols many wepens  
he entretis the listes and what vnaues and other sensibl  
necessaries he bringeth in with hym. In the same man schal  
be don to the defendant. **H**lo the constable schal mak  
take heide that non other before ne behinde the appellant

nor the defendant bryngge more wepyn nor vnailes other  
then were assynd bi the counte. And yf it be soo that  
the defendant come not to his iorney and at the  
oure and terme lynn bi the counte the Constable schal co-  
mende the marchall for to make talle him at the four  
corners of the lists the whiche schal be done in man as  
as it foloweth. Oyes. Oyez. C. de. B. defendant  
come to yowre iorney whiche ye haue vidurkate at this  
day for to aquite yowre plegges before the kinge the con-  
stable and marchall in yowre defence agayns A. de. E.  
appellant of that that he hathe putt up on yow.

And yf he come not to time he schal be callid the  
secunde time in the same man and at the ende he schal  
say come the day passeth faste and yf he come not at  
that time he schal be callid the thirde time. But that  
this be betwixt hys tierce and none. In the same man  
as before and at the ende he schal say the day passeth faste  
and the oure of none is mye soo that ye come bi the soy-  
de oure of none at farrest in pike that may come.

But hys soo en the constable hathe yeny oure and  
terme vñ to the defendant for to come to his iorney  
nen the lesse yf that he take vñ to the oure of none  
the ingent shulde not bi right goo agayns hym whi-  
chir it be in cas of treason or not. But soo is it not of  
the appellant for he muste holde the houre and tyme  
lurred bi the counte. Wombe any plonginge or excusacion  
what soe en be it in cause of treason.

The appellant and the defendant entrede i the.

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listes with ther armoure wepnes vnailes and leuelfull  
necessaries and counsell as is seyd and as ther are assig-  
ned bi the counte. The Constable schal wre the kniges wil-  
le yf he wil assyne any of his noble lordes or knygthes  
of Worshipe vñ to the seyd pikes and yf he wil that  
the other be made afore him or afore the Constable and  
marchall. And the appellant and defendant schal be  
serched bi the Constable and marchall of therre pouetes  
of armes otherwise callid wepens that they be woorable  
wombe any man disseire on them and yf ther be other  
than reson aperte they schal be taken awaie for reson  
good ferre and lame of armes wil not suffre no gis nor  
disayne in soo gret a dede. And it is to wite that the ap-  
pellant and defendant may be armed as swichly vp  
on ther bodies as they wiff. And than the Constable  
schal sende firste aff the marchall and than for the ap-  
pellant with his counsell for to make his othe. The  
Constable schal axe hym yf he wil any more prest and  
that he putte forthe all his prestacions bi writinge for  
fro that time forth he schal make no prestacion. The  
constable schal haue his clerke redy in his presence that  
schal leyn forthe a masse booke open. And than the Con-  
stable schal make his seyd clerke rede the bille of the ap-  
pellant enterly on hysght and the bille redde the con-  
stable schal say to the appellant. A. de. E. thou knowest  
wel this bille and this warant and wod that thou  
gane in oure counte. thou schal say thy right honde here  
vp on thys seyntes and schal swere i maner as folowey.

C. de. B. thi aduise that schal come ayens the Wende in these listis this day in his defens. Ye that thou ne trustest in non other thinge but onsl in god and thi body and on thi rightful quarell so helpe the god and these halowes and the othe made he schal be led agayne to his place. In the same wch schal be don to the defendant. **T**he whiche othes made and ther chamburleyne and fiammetis pit a way. the Constable schal make calle bi the marchall the appellant and the defendant also the whiche schal be ledde

and keptis bi the men of the Constable and marchall before them and the Constable schal say to bothe the pnes. **T**hon A. de. b. appellour schal take. C. de. B. defendant bi the rit honde and he the. And we defende you and ethone of you in the kinges name and vp on the pike that longers ther to and vp on pike of lesinge yowre quarell the whiche that is founden i desaite that non of you be so hardy to doo to other ille ne grevance thurstinge nor other harme bi the honde vp on the pike afore sayde and this char ge remy. the Constable schal make yene ther right handis to gedir and ther litle hondes vp on the missale saynige to the appellour. **A** de. b. appellour thou swerest bi the feynthe that thou yevenest in the honde of thine aduisarie. C. de. B. defendanture and bi all the halowes that thou touchest with thi litle honde that thou to day this day schal doo all thi trewe power and entente bi all the weyes that thou best may or canste to preue thine entente on. C. de. B. thi aduisarie and defendanture to make him yelden him up in to thine honde and creant to tric or speke or ells make him die bi thine honde to fore that thou Wende one of these listis bi the tyme and the summe that the is assynd bi the courte bi thi feynthe and soo helpe the god and these halowes. **O** de. of kyngis of them. But the two lisennants of the Consta-  
ble and marchall schal hane in therre handes outter a  
spere wonne pren for to depre them of the knyge wylle  
make them abide in ther feghtinge wherbi it be to refe  
them or other thinge what sonn en him liker. **A**nd  
it is to be knolwen that yf any admunistracion schulde  
be made to the appellant or to the defendant of uete  
or of drinke or any other necessarie thinge lefusst aft'

that the conuict of frendes and frenen schal be put away  
of the appellant and of the defendant as is sayde the  
seyde admunistracion apperteneth to the herawdes and also  
all the tries made in the seyde courte the whiche kyng  
herawdes and purserawdes schal hane a place for the  
assignd bi the Constable and marchall as iye the lites  
as may goodly be so that they may see all the dede &  
to be redy yf ther be callid for to doo any thynge. **T**he  
appellant i his place kepte bi sonn me assignd bi the Con-  
stable or marchall & the defendant i his place i the same  
wise. Both the two made redy and arrayed & in fleschipe  
bi ther keepers abone sayde the marchall is the ton prie & the  
leuerain of the Constable is the tother. The Constable st-  
tinge in his place abone sayde afore the kyng as his vicer  
genass and pnes made redy for to feghtre as is sayde bi the  
comandement of the kyng. The constable schal say i hys  
voice as foloweth. lessiz lez aler that is to say lat them  
goe and refe a while. lessiz lez aler and refe a nonther  
while. lessiz lez aler a fair leue denour depdien. that is  
to say lat them goe and dos ther denour i goddes name  
And this seyde ech man schal depre fro botthe pnes so  
that they may incontra i doo that them semper bestre  
The appellant ne the defendant may nonther cre nor  
drinke fro that time forthe wonne leue & licence of the  
kyng for thinge that myght falle but yf ther wol do it  
bi the consentise betwix them. **E**t this tyme forthe it  
is to be considered diligentia bi the constable that yf the  
kyng wylle make the pnes feghtinge depre refe or abide

for wham sum en cause it be. that he take good kepe how  
they are deponed so that they be in the same estate and degré  
in all thinges yf the kinge wil sure or make them goo to  
gedre agayne and also that he haue good harkeninge and  
sygnes vñ to them yf oþer speke to other be it of yelwige  
or other wise for vñ to him longeth the wittesse and the  
recordē of the wordes fro that time forthē to non other  
**A**nd yf the seyde bates of treason he that is comite &  
disounit schal be disarmed in the lists by the coman-  
dement of the Constable and a corn of the lists broken in  
the repreoue of him by the wylle schal be drauen oure  
wrch hors fro the same place there he is sooo disarmed  
thorow the lippes vñ to the place of iuste wher he schal  
be hied or hongid aft the usage of the cuntrie the wylle  
thinge apperteneth to the iustial and to onseue and to pfor-  
me his seyde office and to put him in execucion and to  
goo or ride and to be alvey by hym til it be done and at  
þormed and aswet of the appellant as of the defendant  
for good feythe and right and salve of armes wiff that

it happen sooo that the kinge wold take the quarell in  
his hande and make them accordid wome more feghtinge  
Than the Constable takinge the ton prie and the iustial  
the tocher and lede them afore the kinge and he schewyn-  
ge them his wylle the seyde Constable and iustial schal  
lede them to the on prie of the lists w<sup>t</sup> all there poyntz  
and armes as they are founden and hanȝe wher the

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kyng took the quarell in his hande as is seyde. And soo  
they schal be led oure of the gate of the lists enclyp so that  
the ton goo not afore the tocher bi no wey i noo thinge  
for sume the hath taken the quarell in his hande it schul-  
de be dishonest that oþer of the pries schulde haue moe  
disvorshipe than the tocher wherfore it hath bei seyde  
bi many annient me that see that gooth firste oure of  
the lists hath the disvorshipe and this is aswet i cause  
of treason as in other cause what sooo en it be. The fee  
of the herawdes is all the poyntes & armes brokis þis  
rakes away or leuch aft that he is entred the lists awer  
of the appellant as of the defendant and all the poyn-  
tes and armes of hym that is disounit be it the appellant  
oþer the defendant. The fee of the marshal is the  
lists the barrers and the postes of them.
